County 4-H Day Ribbon Placings
<p>County 4-H Day utilizes a modified Danish system of ribbon placing. The judge will place contestants in one of three ribbon groups based on performance as compared to that of an ideal performance. There is no limit to the number of blue, red, or white ribbons that are given. The ribbon groups and their significance are:</p> <p>>Top Blue - Number presented is limited by division. Awarded to recognize outstanding performance of an entry that will represent our county at Regional 4-H Day. First and second alternates may be named at the discretion of the judge.</p> <p>> Blue - To recognize a very good performance which met all of the class requirements. The performance contained a few flaws but was well above minimum standards.</p> <p>> Red - To recognize a good performance which met all the class requirements. The performance was at minimum standards. Although displaying good effort, the performance contained several flaws.</p> <p>> White - To recognize a performance which met the class requirements, but was below minimum standards. The performance contained several flaws and considerable room for improvement exists.</p> <p><i>At Regional Day, 4-Hers must compete in the division or category of which they qualified at the county level. Any group that does not meet minimum requirements or exceeds the time limit will automatically be lowered one ribbon placing.</i></p>
