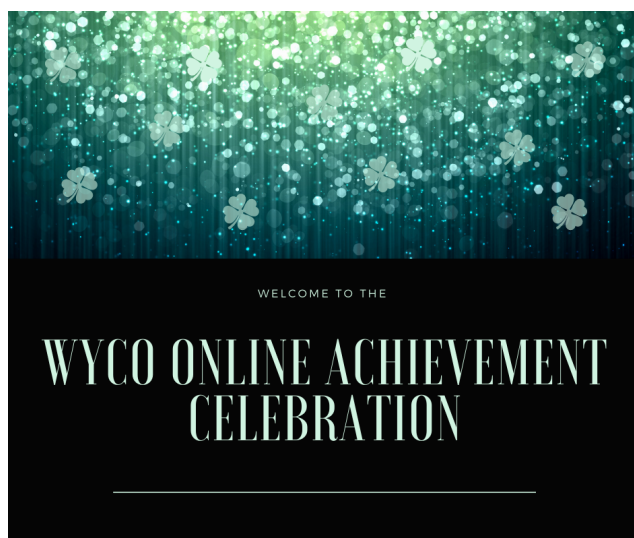
4-H AT HOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS
