
# THE CLOVER CONNECTION

### PROJECT UPDATES!


#### HORSE PROJECT

We are 3 lessons into our 9 sessions of studying before KS Horse Panorama at the end of January. Today they gathered in groups of 4-5 to construct the horse digestive system out of playdough. Each group had a different region and had to construct their digestive region and tell what it's main functions are.

Last Friday they learned about hoof and foot structure, common equine diseases and coat colors at our monthly meeting. Next Sunday we will learn about confirmation, soundness and blemishes. We will also begin learning about aging a horse by it's teeth. 14 attended Sunday and 12 attended on Friday.

Our two coaches are Cara Eldredge and Erica Slaymaker. They are new volunteers for the horse project.





#### DOG PROJECT

The Dog Project met at a Piper Heritage Vet Clinic for their December 2022 meeting for a tour of the facilities and to learn more about veterinary practices and vet school. Dog project members enjoyed their time at the clinic!
