

Champions Livestock Judging Camp

Itvestock judging camps will be held on June 5-7, 12-14, and 15-17. This camp focuses on reason development and presentation. The camp is open to youth ages 14-18 years old who are seriously interested in enhancing their livestock judging and oral communication skills. Prior livestock judging experience is necessary for this camp. Workouts will be conducted similar to those at a collegiate level. The camp will focus primarily on the proper format, terminology, and presentation of oral reasons. Camp participants will also be exposed to livestock evaluation skills and incorporating performance records in the decision-making process.
